SEVILLA

TO DO

> PLAZA DE ESPANA

This is a MUST DO. Built as a part of the 1929 World's Fair, this plaza is one of the most gorgeous displays of tile work. For only a plaza, there is so much to take in! There's even a small river along the edge where you can go paddle boating! Fun fact: if it looks at all familiar, it's because they filmed scenes from "Star Wars" episodes 2 & 3 here!

> REAL ALCAZAR

This is another MUST. Built to replicate the Alhambra in Granada, this palace Fun fact: they filmed scenes from "Game of Thrones" in the gardens!

CATEDRAL & GIRALDA

The Catedral in Sevilla is argued to be the largest church in the world (in terms of volume). Built in the 15th century, its impressive grandeur is definitely worth seeing. Plus, it houses parts of Christopher Columbus's remains!

The Giralda is the minaret / bell tower connected to the Cathedral. From its top level, you get without a doubt the best views of the city. Fun fact: there are only 17 steps in the entire tower. Think about it.

LA CASA DE LA MEMORIA

Sevilla is the birthplace of Sevillianas, a dance very similar to flamenco. If you have time, you should definitely check out a show! I have seen been to this particular studio 3 different times and have never been disappointed! They have some of the most innovative and passionate dancers I have ever seen!

> CALLE BETIS

Right on the waterfront, this bar area has a ton of places to go dancing or to catch a late night Flamenco show!

> PLAZA ALFALFA

With a great nighttime ambiance, you can easily spend a night bar hoping through this central part of town.

RONDA

> PUENTE NUEVO

The iconic symbol of Ronda, this bridge dates back from the 18th century and is one of three bridges that crosses the El Tajo Gorge

> BANOS ARABES

Built in the 13th / 14th centuries, these baths are hark back to a time when southern Spain was part of the medieval Muslim territory, Al-Andalus. Make sure you check out the educational video that explains exactly how the baths worked!

PLAZA DE TOROS

Most cities in Spain have their own bullring, but this is one of the oldest Plazas de Toros in Spain. It is rumored to be one of both Ernest Hemingway and Orson Welles' favorite places

PALACIO DE MONDRAGON

Once the home of one of Ronda's Muslim rulers, the building now remains as a beautiful example of mixed architecture, incorporating Islamic, Gothic and Renaissance styles
